The meeting of the Fall River Rural Electric Cooperative, Inc. Board of Directors was held on Monday, March 28, 2022, virtually and at the main office of Fall River Rural Electric in Ashton, Idaho. Having determined a quorum was present, President Draper called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. Executive Assistant Angie Haws recorded the minutes. The invocation was given by Georg Behrens. GUEST ROGER GRAY, PNGC CEO, TO DISCUSS BPA POST 2028 EFFORTS

PNGC is a generation and transmission cooperative owned by 15 cooperative members. They exist solely for the benefit of their members and help them with their power supply, which usually represents about one-half of a utility's total cost. Because generation and transmission are larger-scale businesses and cooperatives are usually small utilities, G&Ts have formed across the nation to lower cost and risk.

2028 is an important year for all consumer-owned utilities in the region, including PNGC, because BPA power contracts terminate.

FINANCIAL & STATISTICAL REPORT FEBRUARY 28, 2022, FINANCIAL REPORTS

CFO Barney reported on the financials for February stating the net margins YTD were \$265K better than budgeted. The major driver for increased margins is revenue net of power cost. The average usage per meter is higher than the five-year average used for the budget and slightly higher than last year. In addition, January and February temperatures were colder than average. The biggest reason for the variance is growth in new services. The budget was based on 2 to 3% growth, and our annual growth rate is at 3.8%. Other budget variances are mainly due to timing of actual expenses versus when they were budgeted. Cooperative equity is just under 50%. We paid \$943K in principal payments on long-term debt. YTD there has been just over \$400K of cash generated from operations.

The board discussed growth in the area, possible economic impacts, and availability of materials.

LONG RANGE TECHNOLOGY PLAN WITH HELP FROM NRTC \$30,000 CEO Case stated the Fall River staff recommend adjusting the operating budget to allow for the development of a long-range technology plan working with NRTC to assess and provide data to facilitate implementation of the plan.

Director Crowther made a motion to authorize changes to the operating budget to allow the Cooperative to develop a long-range technology plan consulting with NRTC. Director Robson seconded. A voice vote was taken; THE MOTION CARRIED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE.

UPDATE OF FALL RIVER'S EV TESLA LEASE PROGRAM

HYDRO FACILITIES UPDATE

Island Park and Buffalo hydros generated a total of 561,015 kWh in February. This amounts to 1.6% of all the kWh billed by PNGC in February, and 1.6% of all kWh sold and used by Fall River in February.

Felt hydro produced 1,276,000 kWh in February. When this is included with Island Park and Buffalo, it amounts to 5.1% of all the kWh billed by PNGC in February, and 5.2% of all kWh sold and used by Fall River in February.

Island Park hydro produced 486,155 kWh during the month of February.

BUFFALO

Buffalo hydro produced 74,860 kWh during the month of February.

FELT

Felt hydro produced 1,276,000 kWh during the month of February.

CHESTER

Chester hydro did not run during the month of February. The plant has been shut down since the 19th of December due to too much ice in the intake.

Case reviewed big picture items noting oil, natural gas, aluminum, copper, steel, palladium, nickel, and neon are raw materials that are exported by Russia and Ukraine. Fall River has been proactive in ordering and trying to secure materials needed for the coming year and have already placed orders for some material for 2024. The continued pressures on material supplies and now a reduction in raw materials sets the stage for additional price hikes and material shortages. Staff will continue to strive to secure the material we need and to date feel cautiously optimistic.
