Become a Fall River Board Candidate



If you or someone you know resides in any of the three districts where board of director candidates are being sought this year, there is still time to have your name appear on the ballot. Nomination by petition is as easy as obtaining fifteen signatures of Cooperative members from within the district the potential candidate is seeking to represent. The three board seats up for election this year include District 2, West Victor, presently represented by Jay Hanson, who has reached his term limits and is not eligible for re-election; District 3, East Victor, where Georg Behrens currently serves; and District 8, northern Island Park, currently represented by Jeff Keay.

The names and signatures on the nomination by petition must arrive at the Ashton, Idaho, office of Fall River Electric by Friday, April 21, 2023, in order to be placed on the official election ballot. Interested members should also include a quality photo and a statement as to why they should be elected to the board. Remember, to be a qualified candidate, you must live in the district of which you are seeking election. Qualifications and expectations for board members can be found in our bylaws located on our website, www.fallriverelectric.com. Click the "My Cooperative" tab and then the dropdown menu, "Bylaws."

Remember, the deadline for candidate petitions is April 21, 2023.

Patronage Capital Report Arrives In April



In April, every owner-member of Fall River Electric will receive a summary of the Patronage Capital they have earned in 2022, as well as any previous earnings since becoming a customer. Patronage Capital is your share of the revenue collected in excess of the costs to operate Fall River Electric. We refer to that excess as "margins" and it is based on the amount of electricity you use annually. Fall River uses margins as a resource to rebuild aging infrastructure and maintain system reliability. Each December, your elected board determines how much Patronage Capital can be paid back to its members.
