# Fall River Board Candidates Wanted

A nomination by petition is as easy as obtaining fifteen signatures of Cooperative members from within the district of which you are seeking to be a candidate. The three board seats up for election this year include District 1, Rexburg/Ririe, presently represented by Brent Crowther; District 5, West Driggs/ Tetonia, where Brent Robson currently serves; and District 6, the Ashton area, currently represented by Dede Draper.

Names and signatures for the nomination by petition must arrive at the Ashton, Idaho, office of Fall River Electric by Monday, April 26, 2021, in order to be placed on the official election ballot.

Interested members should also include a quality photo and a statement as to why they should be elected to the board. Remember, to be a qualified candidate, you must live in the district of which you are seeking election. 

### **Report On Patronage Capital Earnings** For 2020 Arrives Next Month



In April, every owner-member of Fall River Electric will receive a summary of the Patronage Capital they have earned in 2020, as well as any previous earnings since becoming an owner-member of the Cooperative. Patronage Capital is your share of the margins generated beyond the costs to operate Fall River Electric. All Patronage Capital amounts earned are based on the amount of electricity you use, with cash payments made each December on an approximate twenty-year payback cycle. ### **Take Home Safety – Food Safety**

The U.S. Food & Drug Administration says 1 in 6 Americans suffer foodborne illnesses annually. Consuming dangerous foodborne bacteria can make you sick in as little as 20 minutes. Here are steps to take to prevent your family from getting sick from a foodborne illness:

- Wash your hands and surfaces with soap and water for at least 20 seconds;
- Separate raw meats from other foods when preparing them and never thaw foods at room
- Cook foods to a safe internal temperature to destroy bacteria; and
- Refrigerate foods within one hour after preparation at 40 degrees F or below.
